Given the nature of this position, the successful applicant will also be an active member of an independent Christian Church or Church of Christ, which represents the University's primary religious constituency. Teaching experience in the classroom and appropriate doctorate are required. Applicants should be experienced in or willing to train for online course instruction. Experience in ministry is valued. Salary and benefits are competitive for this 10-month faculty position.
