

Seminary - Old Testament Faculty Position Announcement

The Lincoln Christian University Seminary invites applications for a full-time faculty member in the area of Old Testament, effective August 1, 2012. Teaching experience in the classroom and a PhD (or equivalent degree) are required. Applicants should have a broad background in Old Testament studies and be able to teach seminary classes in a variety of Old Testament areas. Applicants should also have a passion for teaching, a spirit of collegiality, and an ability to draw prospective students. Applicants should support the University's mission, vision, core values, and basic beliefs (for more information, see "About Us" on our website at www.lincolnchristian.edu). Applicants should balance a commitment to the Church with a desire to engage the academic world in scholarly writings and presentations. Given the nature of this position, preferential consideration will be given to active members of independent Christian Churches or Churches of Christ, as these represent the University's primary religious constituency. Experience in ministry is valued. Applicants should be experienced in or willing to train for online course instruction. Salary and benefits are competitive for this 10-month faculty position.
